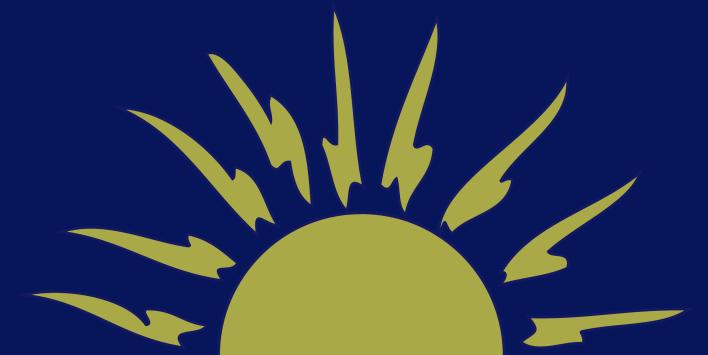

## **MV 14 & Under Champs**

What-a-weekend for 14 & Under Swimmers! This was a long anticipated meet which did not disappoint. Blazers had put in some serious work since April in preparation for the end of the Summer Championship meet.

The Blazers had 91 athletes compete at MV LCM Age Group Champs - the highest number in recent years. We had an excellent showing, fast swimming which resulted in the Blazers winning the meet by over 2000 points.

We had countless athletes on the podium over the weekend in individual and relay events.

Additionally, Blazers took home 4 out of 6 Individual age group
Champion banners! KCB proudly celebrates our champion
banners in the following age groups: 10 & under Girls, 10 & under
Boys, 11-12 Girls and 11-12 Boys. Our 13-14 Girls and Boys
categories came close as runner ups. Congratulations to an
awesome group effort across all the age groups!!

Overall Blazers dominated this summer not only in Missouri Valley but even outside of our region! Every single swimmer should be proud of their achievements this season.

We had some highs and lows this summer but together we accomplished a lot, learned a lot, and grew to be better athletes and teammates. The support has been great for the swimmers, families and for the coaches - Thank you!

## **Region 8 Sectionals**

We had 16 swimmers participate in this Summer's Region VIII Sectional meet, 13 competed in individual events. By the end of the weekend every individual qualifier had made at least one Final. Among non-college teams we finished 12th overall moving up 7 spots from our team place in the Spring, Our girls finished 8th (moving up 5 spots) and our boys finished 19th (moving up 8 spots).

We had some fantastic individual performances as well: Miles Tomsic broke a minute in the 100 Fly for the first time, Ashlyn Hines got her first Sectional cut time trialing the 50 Free, Maggie Dahl got her Sectional cut in the 400 Free, Casey Carpenter-Ross qualified for USA Swimming Futures in the 200 Free, Andrew Martin qualified for USA Swimming Futures in the 200 Back and Abby Stidham-Ebberts got her first USA Swimming Summer Junior National cut in the 100 Breast.

Just a fantastic weekend for the Blazers at the Sectional meet, and we left that weekend feeling great about what we can accomplish as a team next Spring!

## **USA Swimming Futures**

Three Blazer swimmers qualified for and participated at the USA Swimming Futures meet in Madison, WI, Casey Carpenter-Ross, Andrew Martin & Abby Stidham-Ebberts. There are five sites for Futures and the Wisconsin site was by far the largest. There were over 120 teams and 800 athletes at the site. It was an amazing experience for these three swimmers at a national level meet. Abby made Finals in the 100 Breast and 50 Breast, no small feat given the number of athletes at the meet!

## **Summer Juniors**

Abby Stidham-Ebberts traveled to Irvine, CA to represent the Kansas City Blazers at this year's Summer Junior Nationals. Abby competed in the 50 Breast and 100 Breast. Abby went a best time in the 50 breaststroke, finishing 50th overall and breaking the LSC Record in the 15-16 50 Breaststroke going 33.52!!









## Summer Meets

## Ragnarok

Blazers traveled to Joplin, MO for the 4th year in a row to attend the Ragnarok meet. The Blazers had a little over 90 athletes traveling and swimming for this meet.

Blazers dominated the meet with numerous hardware and awards. The Blazers scored the most points and won the meet with 774.5pts and outscored the second place team by 348 points! For the first time, Blazers received a second trophy at the meet for the highest percentage of most improved times based from all our athlete swims. This calculated out to 49% best times from a total of 700+ KCB swims from the whole weekend. We had countless top 8 finishes which included 124 top 3 finishes (56 of them were 1st place finishes).

## **14&Under ZONES**

#### What is Zones?

Zones is a big Championship meet for 14&under swimmers. Each LSC compiles a team of its fastest age group swimmers to compete against other LSCs in the same zone, and these swimmers compete under the name of their LSC (not their clubs). Our LSC is Missouri Valley and we are part of the Central Zone.

Central Zone is one of the four zones of USA Swimming, consisting of: Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Lake Erie, Michigan, Midwestern, Minnesota, Missouri Valley, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Ozark, South Dakota and Wisconsin.

#### How do athletes qualify?

To qualify for Zones swimmers need to achieve at least one triple A time (AAA) in their corresponding age group (10&under, 11-12, 13-14) found at USA

Swimming Motivational Time Standards.

#### Blazers at 2025 Zones

Coach Uldis was serving as Head Coach and coach Rhys was selected as an assistant coach for this year's Zones team.

Blazers had the biggest representation from Missouri Valley at this meet - 18 athletes.

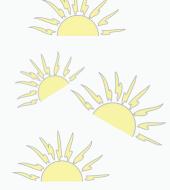

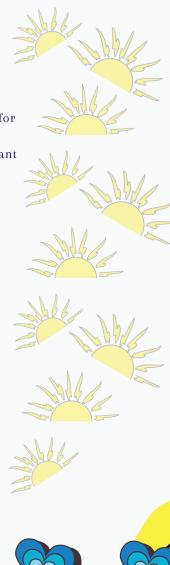

## **IMX / IMR Information**

From USA Swimming Website: "IM Xtreme is a program that allows USA Swimming members to track their times (or coaches to track their team's times) against swimmers all across the nation! Just by swimming a specific program of events, you can see where you rank against your teammates, your region, and yes, even across the USA!"

"IM Ready is the little brother of IM Xtreme, tailored toward our younger swimmers. Does 200 yards seem a little much? Then start getting 'IM Ready' by swimming shorter distances and keeping track of your improvements"

Ready to move forward? The next step is IM Xtreme (IMX). The IMX ranking includes a series of five or six events at longer distances.

200 Free, 100 Back, 100 Breast, 100 Fly, 200 IM

#### 11-12 Year Olds

500 Free, 100 Back, 100 Breast, 100 Fly, 200 IM

#### 13&Over

500 Free, 200 Back, 200 Breast, 200 Fly, 200 IM, 400 IM

## Why Do the Blazers Focus on IMX/IMR

Not only is IMX/IMR a great way to see how swimmers compare to other swimmers in their age group, it is also a great evaluating tool for us coaches. We believe in developing well rounded swimmers that can compete in an array of strokes and distances. Using the IMX/IMR events, we coaches can evaluate how well our swimmers are implementing the skills we are teaching in practice. We can look for patterns, either with times or with common mistakes our swimmers are making with their technique.

IMX/IMR events also encourage swimmers to step out of their comfort zone and try new events. Swimming the 400/500 Free, the 200/400 IM, or the 100/200 Fly can seem overwhelming for kids, but using the IMX/IMR events provides us an opportunity to try them. When swimmers know they are working towards completing a specific goal it helps focus and guide them during practices.

Additionally, all Blazer swimmers who complete IMX or IMR will receive a bag tag to represent their achievement.

#### **Swim Meet Reminders:**

Parents are **NOT** allowed in the hallway leading to the pool deck or on the pool deck <u>at any time</u> unless they are volunteering for that session.

Parents are **NOT** allowed to take pictures or videos from behind the blocks, and this includes the glass windows above the pool. If the officials see it happening, they will ask for it to stop and if it becomes a persistent problem, the person breaking the rule will be asked to leave.

Parents are **NOT** allowed in the locker rooms during meets.

The locker rooms are for **athletes ONLY**.

Swim-a-Thon is Kansas City Blazers' single largest fundraiser. Prior to the actual Swim-A-Thon event, swimmers will obtain pledges either per lap or as a flat donation from family, friends, or neighbors. On the day of the event, swimmers swim as many laps as they can in designated time, with the goal of completing 100 laps or 200 laps.

Our team keeps 95% of the funds raised. Funds raised go towards the basic needs of the team including increasing pool rental costs, training aids, coaches training, and swimmer rewards. The remaining 5% goes to USA Swimming to support nationwide initiatives including Coaches Clinics, Leadership Conferences, Make a Splash Foundation, and supporting the National Team Athletes and Coaches.
